FUTURITY/DERBY PROGRAM

The WPRC Futurity and Derby program is the beginning steps of turning barrel horse prospects into champion rodeo horses.

The program, which began in 2006, is for building better rodeo horses that will last through the years. The program gives members a place to take young horses and introduce them to the competition arena but in a more relaxed atmosphere.

The Futurities are open to horses 5-years-

old and younger that are competing for the first time, while the Derby program is for 6-and 7-year-old horses, as long as they did not compete in Futurities as a 4-year old. A horse that starts his competitive career as a 4-year-old has two years of eligibility, but as a 5- and 6-year-old.

The program has proven a great training ground for building rodeo horses of the future.

JUST GETTING 'EM STARTED

Grimes claims first world titles with the Futurity 1D and Derby; Vondra claims 4th Futurity 2D Title

Kathy Grimes took Extraco Events Center by storm, leaving the WPRC World Finals in Waco, Texas with world titles in the Futurity 1D and the Derby divisions. These are the first world titles for Grimes, and both came aboard young stallions bred and raised by Grimes' program in Medical Lake, Washington.

Every time Colleen Vondra has been to the WPRC World Finals, she has left with the Futurity 2D world title. Her victory in 2022 makes her fourth title overall that she has taken home to northern Illinois.

Grimes' Fourth Generation takes Futurity 1D Title

Kathy Grimes knew the points were going to be close for the world title when she looked at the standings in early September. She decided to make the 1,960 mile trip to Waco to fight for the world title. However, on October 16th she broke her ribs and was not able to ride — so her dear friend Leah Crockett made the trip with her and rode both Grimes' futurity and derby horses at the

finals.

"I wasn't able to ride yet, and I didn't really feel like I could go by myself," Grimes noted. "So, I coned my friend Leah into going with me and taking 10 days out of her life to go and help me. It's kind of stressful to get on someone else's horse and she did great."

The year-end futurity 1D champion horse is KG Jukebox Hero, or "Tillman," by Blazin Jetolena and out of KG Justiceweexpected, or "Issy," one of Grimes' mares that helped her qualify for the 2017 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo. Tillman had an incredible finals, finishing second in the average and securing Grimes' first-ever world title. The 5-year-old bay stallion placed in both rounds at the finals to finish out his futurity year by adding another \$3,584 to his earnings.

"He does try really hard, and I've really enjoyed him," Grimes said. "He's had a great, solid year too. He has just been pretty consistent and won about \$58,000 this year."

Tillman makes the fourth generation that Grimes has ridden in her nearly 30 years of breeding barrel horses. Grimes rode Issy's dam, Do It For Beau, to fill her WPRC permit in 2006, and had run barrels on Do It For Beau's sire, Beaus Scoop of Sun, as well.

"It's really a family affair," Grimes said. "Now to start riding some of [Issy's] foals, and they're doing great...it is really exciting. It's really neat to see how far it's come."

Grimes, who is also a veterinarian, and Tillman will be home from mid-April to mid-June for the breeding season and then Grimes has plans to enter him in some derbies, and possibly some rodeos, in 2023.

"He's just a fun horse," Grimes said. "He's just kind of like a big goober, always got something in his mouth. [He's] always happy, meets you at the gate and wants to go do whatever."

Derby Champion was Bred for Greatness

The last time Kathy Grimes made the three-day trip to the WPRC World Finals was in 2012 for Issy's futurity year. A full brother

to Issy, KG Juststealingcash, or "Phoenix," is by Judge Cash and out of Do It For Beau. The 7-year-old sorrel stallion won Grimes her first Derby world title.

"Phoenix is more on the serious side — he's all business," Grimes said. "It's great he has this derby world title on his résumé as we progress to some rodeos!"

Grimes ran Phoenix in futurities as a 5-year-old and had a good year, but COVID-19 caused many producers to cancel most of the large futurities that year. This gives him an extra year in the derbies, and Grimes says he has been coming along nicely.

"He's been a nice, solid horse that hopefully we will transition to some more rodeos this next year as an 8-year-old!" Grimes noted.

Both world titles are special to Grimes and the culmination of nearly 30 years in breeding barrel horses.

"I think that's really cool that both of them won the world titles. I've never done that with any of my horses," Grimes said. "They're really nice, solid horses that come from a winning family of barrel horses, so I'm just excited about their futures."

Grimes wants to thank her sponsors LMF Feeds, Best Ever Pads, Purple Rein Creations, and Wheatland Bank.

"I am invested in the barrel racing world and my horses come from a long line of barrel racing horses that I have bred, raised, and trained, and then compete on. That's what I continue to want to do, and I hope that mare owners can see that in my program."

Vondra and Peso earn Futurity 2D Title

Colleen Vondra rode SR French Fire Water, or "Peso," to the Futurity 2D world title. The 5-year-old gelding is by Frenchmans Royal CJ (owned by Ed Pfaff) and out of SR Firewater Girl.

The Harvard, Illinois cowgirl first won the Futurity 2D world title in 2010 and has won

the title every four years since then. Vondra didn't have it planned this way, but this year more than ever it just happened to work out.

The four-time Great Lakes Circuit finalist had two finished horses she was going to run in rodeos and was not going to run Peso in the futurities. Unfortunately, both her finished horses came up sick, and Vondra's futurity colts got the call to start running.

Peso's first competition run was made this July and he began to climb in the world standings. Peso placed in the top 10 of the 2D in both rounds at the finals to secure the 2022 world title.

"It's pretty cool," Vondra said. "It wasn't really part of the plan, but that kind of just goes to show we're not the one that's in control of that."

Vondra says Peso can be a bit of a handful. He came to Vondra as an outside horse for her to train, and he stayed because he was so quirky. She had then tried to sell him when he was younger, but knew he was going to need to go to the right rider if she did.

"I knew that he was not going to be for just everybody and I wanted to make sure that he got put in the right spot, so I held on to him because of that," Vondra said.

Vondra likes the setup of the WPRA Futurity with the 2D, because even though running Peso wasn't part of the plan this year, he could still gain experience and earn some money with his late start.

"The futurities, especially with the 2D, is a way you can still go and compete, and them not be solid and ready to hit the rodeos yet."

Vondra says Peso went from the horse no one wanted to buy to one she is not selling. She is excited with the progress he has made so far and knows that all the greats have a few quirks.

"I want to season him to rodeos this year and maybe a few derbies," Vondra said. "I think he will have a fun style for our circuit!"

JUNIOR DIVISION

It remains one of the most indelible images of WPRA history. Blonde curls bobbing, bat clinched firmly between her teeth, a barely teen-aged Clayton, N.M., cowgirl roared into the history books of barrel racing. Charmayne James was just 14 when she and super horse Scamper won the first of a record 10 straight world championships. Along the way, she captured the hearts of rodeo fans across the nation.

The site of young girls guiding their top equine partners flawlessly through a barrel pattern disappeared in the mid-nineties when the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association initiated a mandatory age limit of 18 years of age for competitors at PRCA sanctioned rodeos. Due to the relationship between the two sanctioning bodies at the time, the WPRA followed suit and little girls no longer had a place in professional rodeo.

Beginning in 2007, the WPRA instituted the WPRA Junior Division for all girls aged 17 and under. The junior division introduces a

whole new group of members to the ranks of professional competition and allows mothers and daughters to compete for world points at some of the same events.

Juniors run in WPRA Junior sanctioned races as well as co-sanctioned divisional races and rodeos to earn points for the WPRA World Finals. Juniors can only earn points in WPRA Junior Division races, in co-sanctioned rodeos, and in the 1D of co-sanctioned divisional races. Juniors do not compete against WPRA members for points are not eligible to enter WPRA events or rodeos.

Among the big name races co-sanctioned for the WPRA juniors is the world renowned Josey Junior World Championship barrel race. Hosted by legends RE and Martha Josey, the 1980 WPRA World Champion, this race has played host to thousands of aspiring barrel racers through the years, many of whom have gone on to tremendous success in the ranks of the WPRA.

ALVES ADDS WPRA JUNIOR WORLD TITLE TO RESUME

Beginning in 2007, the WPRA instituted the WPRA Junior Division for all girls aged 17 and under. The junior division introduces a whole new group of members to the ranks of professional competition and allows mothers and daughters to compete for world points at the same events. Callie duPerier won the Junior World title in 2010 and went on to win the WPRA Barrel Racing World Title in 2015. Jackie Ganter won the title in 2014 and qualified for the Wrangler NFR in 2015 and 2016.

In 2022, Skylar Alves of Camarillo, California, won the title with \$11,499 in earnings while Kaitlyn Sims of Elkton, Florida was second with \$10,562.

WPRA: Last year you finished as reserve world champion and in 2022 you won the world title. What does it mean to you to be a WPRA Junior World Champion?

Skylar: I am at a loss for words as to how ecstatic this title makes me feel. It allows me to leave behind my junior rodeo career as I become an adult. It gives me a sense of completeness and confidence as I head into this next season of life with my best partner and my best friend: JR Finally Famous.

Note: JR Finally Famous is by Famous Bugs out of Dustys Jazzy Dancer and she calls her 12-year old mare Finally

JUNIOR DIVISION

WPRA: Did finishing reserve in 2021 give you momentum to win it in 2022?

Skylar: I would say instead of giving me momentum this reserve title gave me motivation to take that extra step for the lead and finish the year strong. It fueled and inspired my desire to win and grow as an athlete.

WPRA: This was your last year to be able to win the Junior World Title so how important was it to you to win the title?

Skylar: I don't think this title defines who I am as a person or a rider, but I do believe it was important to win this title to prove to myself that I can achieve anything I put my mind to, and that Finally and I could achieve something so incredible.

WPRA: What was the difference this year to finally get that title?

Skylar: It's interesting to use the word "finally" in this question, because my horse's barn name is actually "Finally." We call her this because she always tends to live up to her name and achieve great things in her own time, that is, somewhat like her owner. Fortunately, she decided to line up her timing with my final year as a junior competitor.

WPRA: How did you get involved in the sport of rodeo and other family members involved in the sport?

Skylar: My mom, Darleen Alves, showed me my love for horses as soon as I could walk, and I have been riding ever since. My mom is a California circuit competitor herself; and my cousin Pfeiffer Alves competes with me on the college rodeo circuit.

WPRA: For 2023, you have now bought your WPRA permit. What are your goals for 2023?

Skylar: My goals for 2023 are to grow as I am on my own as a freshman at Cal Poly SLO on the rodeo team. I hope to win the region in barrel racing and qualify for the CNFR. I also hope to attend my first pro rodeo and fill my permit.

WPRA: What do you enjoy most about the sport of barrel racing?

Skylar: What I enjoy most about barrel racing is my relationship with my horses, and my relationship with my teammates. I love being able to work so hard at something and grow and thrive and change all with the same companion, my beautiful mare. I also love the way this sport builds character. It is humbling and exciting.
